

Welcome to the Annual General Meeting and BBQ and thank you for attending this evening.

This report summarises the previous year of the Scout Group and looks forward to the future.

The section reports will provide reminders of what the sections have done this year, but I would just like to mention some events that we attended as a group:

- St. George's Day Parade and Service in April
- Bristol South Jamboree (BSJ18) at Woodhouse Park in May
- Whitchurch Royal British Legion Remembrance Sunday in November

Improvements to the building and grounds have continued, with a new kitchen, rearrangement of the toilets and a wheelchair accessible toilet with shower. We have tidied and cleared the outside space over the last few weeks and created a wood pile with axe work area and moved the fire area. Thank you to all those involved, who gave up their valuable time to help the transformation. Future work will include renewing the gutters, improving the external lighting, repainting the outside of the building and providing wheelchair access to the front door.

The numbers of Beavers and Cubs has continued to increase to levels that are not manageable in one section. However, due to the incredible generosity of Carol Ferris, we have recently started a second Beaver Colony which she is running on Thursday evening before the existing colony meets.

We already have more Cubs that we want in a single pack, and with the future extra numbers who will come up from the two Beaver Colonies; we need to start a second pack, which will meet on Wednesday evenings. We already have a few volunteers to help, but we could really do with a few more. Please speak with Carol Mole, Tanya or me if you help.

The Scout Group will celebrate its 60th Birthday in February 2019. We would like to arrange some events to celebrate this major milestone, probably a fun day / party in February and a Group Camp in the spring / summer; so watch out for dates!! I will also be challenging each section to do something memorable in the theme of 60 during 2019!

The 'Pegasus' Explorer Scout Unit (for 14 to 18-year olds) is now up and running. The Unit is open to everyone (between 14 and 18 years old). The unit is not part of the group as Explorers are a District provision, but we continue to have close affiliation to it as its meetings are held in our Headquarters and Stan (Richard Staniland) is the Explorer Scout Leader.

The Beavers have had a busy and very full year. Our numbers are always steady. The majority of Beavers will stay with us until their 8th birthday. We have a full waiting list for the coming year but have addressed the issue of our current waiting list.

I would like to thank them for their help and support over the last year and wish them all the best in the future. I have also had a surprise visit from our District Commissioner who awarded me with my wood badge as I ended my training period.

I would like to thank the following people for taking a more active role; Sarah Mamo for her help as my assistant and Luke Barrett, without their support Beavers could not run.

Our full waiting list has prompted us to set up a 2nd Beaver group on the 21st June 2018. Thanks to Penny Herrington who has agreed to be my assistant along with parent help from Helen Osborne, Katie Frankz, and Paula Lane. The group is small, so we are able to support children with special needs who would benefit from a small group setting. Both groups will follow the same programme.

In the last year Beavers have worked towards gaining all their challenge badges and activity badges. Since our last AGM I have given out 160 badges to the Beavers. Some of the badges they have gained are Hikes, Camping craft, Explore, First aid badges. Over the next few months we will be concentrating on completing challenge badges to enable our older Beavers to gain their Bronze Chief Scout award, the highest award Beavers can earn. As Leaders we are keen for each Beaver within the group to have the opportunity to earn this badge.

We have had an eventful year over the past 12 months; here is a summary of what we have done. In November we all went tobogganing at the Mendip Activity Centre. This was a lovely way to start our Christmas celebrations. At Easter we had an Easter egg hunt where the Beavers had to use a map to find the clues around Stockwood. We also helped with a local community litter pick. In May, 8 of our Beavers attended the BSJ18. They stayed for 2 night in tents and took part in lots of different activities from completing low ropes, obstacle course, talking on the radio, cooking on fire and much more. They were all brilliant. In June we arranged a hike and visit to Horseworld. The Beavers had to make their own pack lunch and hiked over to explore Horseworld. During our visit we enjoyed a very bumpy tractor ride.

Beavers have taken part in the Remembrance Day parade and march from the British Legion in Whitchurch to St Nicholas Church, as well the recent St Georges Day parade held at St Mary Redcliffe Church in the centre of Bristol.

While Tanya became assistant Cub leader and will soon be swapping as leader of our new cub pack. The time we have to devote to fundraising events has become more limited so unfortunately, we have had to reduce the number of events and activities we run.
