This document has been completed to provide a risk assessment for the 148th Bristol (1st Stockwood) Scout Group HQ. It should be read and understood by all Group Leaders and those using the HQ for Scouting activities or private bookings. It will be reviewed and updated regularly and available on request to anyone.

It should be noted this document forms only a part of the mechanism for safety and that risk assessments should be ongoing throughout the meetings. The goal is to encourage a culture of dynamic risk assessment, not just through written documents but by involving all participants, especially the young people in thinking about safety by identifying risks and hazards and discussing what can be done to address them.

The Risk Assessment is presented in seven columns.

- Hazards This section details the hazards associated with the risk
- Who could be harmed?
- L This section details the **Likelihood** that the identified hazard might happen. From 1 = very unlikely through to 5 = Almost certainly going to happen
- S This section details the **Severity** of the hazard, should it occur. From 1 = Very minor concern through to 5 = Very serious
- R This section multiplies the Likelihood with the Severity to determine a **Risk** rating. This rating should be used to prioritise safety management and resources.
- Measures to reduce or manage risk This section is to consider the ways to reduce the Likelihood or Severity of the identified hazard and therefore the Risk.
- Responsibility This section identifies who is responsible for the measures taken to reduce the risk.
